# Items of interest from Committee Meeting held on July 27th 2007

1. Apologies for absence: Alan Honey had resigned on July 19<sup>th</sup> with immediate effect due to business commitments. The committee wished to thank Alan for his significant contributions during his time as a member.

# 2. Matters Arising.

- **Belmont**. The property is now for sale and no further developments are likely until a new owner is in place.
- **First Aid at Regionals.** Katy Dyer's opinion was that this required a higher level of support than was currently available the squad at present has only 7 members. Perhaps the coming First Aid course will produce new recruits.
- **Authorisation of Minor Expenditure**. It is not felt that any change to the constitution is needed. A form of words for authorising expenditure will be considered at the next meeting.

# 3. Reports

- a) Captains...
  - Unfortunately we were only able to field one team this year for the Cotswold Way Relay, as some of the usual stalwarts were abroad doing grander things. Although the forecast for the day was pretty awful, by this summer's standards it turned out to be not too bad, though very slippery underfoot in places. There were some very good performances from members of the team and our overall result was 29th out of 63 teams, but a creditable 8th out of 20 in the mixed team category.
  - We also had a team for the Dorset Coast Path relay (as in previous years blessed with glorious weather). 14 members of the club took part and had a very enjoyable day. We have been considering how we can improve our time (and why the SWJS were nearly an hour ahead of us!)
  - The Klub weekend took place on the Gower in conjunction with the Swansea Bay "Midsummer on the Gower" event. 23 members took part in one or more of the three events. Most of us arrived too late to take part in the Friday evening event, but Saturday was a lovely day for some very interesting and enjoyable courses on Broughton Burrows, marred only by the removal of a control by some youngsters playing in the sand dunes. We all enjoyed a barbecue at the campsite with members of SBOC, followed by the usual rather chaotic but fun rounders game. Despite a drizzly start, everyone thoroughly enjoyed the 2x2 relay on Whiteford Burrows on the Sunday.
  - The Klub championships at Ashton Court had weather more typical of this summer, but 34 hardy souls took part and it was pleasing to see some different names on the prize winners list.
  - We are hoping for a good turnout for the Compass Sport Cup final on 14th October and are currently investigating transport to the proposed Youth Hostel at Ashby de la Zouch. Details will be ready for the next newsletter.
  - We would like to ask everyone to encourage as many juniors as possible to run for us at the first round of the Yvette Baker trophy at Duke's Plantation in the Quantocks on September 16th [Note: this QO event will now not take place.]
- b) Treasurer. Mike Forrest had circulated an updated report by email which will form the basis of his annual report at the forthcoming AGM. It was noted that the final income from the JK was £2150, a very satisfactory outcome and an important contribution to the Klub's current good financial state.
- c) Secretary. All correspondence requiring report had come by email. Items forwarded had concerned Dartmoor 10 Tors challenge on 8-9 September, coaching for teachers course on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, Peter Palmer relays, request from BOF for stories of successful coaching experiences.
- **d) SWOA Rep**. The minutes of the SWOA committee meeting which took place on June 13<sup>th</sup> had been circulated before the meeting. The committee's attention was drawn to the date of the SWOA AGM (September 22<sup>nd</sup>, after day 1 of the Caddihoe Chase).
  - The committee had also been sent the email exchange on QO's desire to use the Joe Lee punching

system for a Regional event which had followed the June 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. This had culminated in a request from Roger Craddock, QO chairman, to all club Chairpersons for their support in lobbying SWOA to bring forward the next committee meeting to August 22<sup>nd</sup> in order to reconsider the approval of the Joe Lee system for such an event. The chairman agreed to reply to QO and SWOA with the committee's opinion that QO should be allowed to go ahead. It was not clear why a meeting should be necessary if a majority of SWOA clubs were in favour.

- e) ASO Rep. Pete Foster presented his draft proposal for an ASO Whistle Policy. The enforcement of whistle-carrying was in keeping with West Midlands Orienteering Association policy and has majority support in ASO. It would be standard practice in future for ASO members, teachers and parents. Enforcement would be more straightforward if BOK followed suit. It was hoped that at some point it could be recommended as standard policy in the region. The committee proved to be unanimously in favour. All publicity should state the 'No whistle, no go' policy and adult members will be asked to support it as a good example to children. It was agreed that at the Start, adults will be asked whether they have a whistle and Juniors will be asked to show that they have. Peter will draft a recommendation for the Klub to adopt.
- f) Web-site. Steve Horton had sent a report on web-site developments, circulated before the meeting. The committee again wished to compliment Steve on developments on the web-site, but would like to understand the distinction between visits, pages and hits.
